We have been learning all about Lunar New Year this term, including names for animals, what an arch looks like and building our own arches, learning about the custom of giving cards and money - we made our own money wallets and put a chocolate coin inside, we learnt about China and how far away it was. LITTLE ACORNS (2-3S)

We've been promoting independence at snack time by encouraging children to collect their own bowl and spoon, choose their cereal, and fill their bowl using a twisting motion—great for fine motor skills!

Our new sensory area offers exciting opportunities for children to explore textures, smells, sounds, and movement, supporting brain development and problem-solving skills. We've also introduced a maths area, where children can engage with numbers, shapes, and measurement through hands-on play. Although mathematical concepts are all around us, this dedicated space provides extra opportunities for children to develop their early numeracy skills through play.

Despite the cold weather, outdoor play remains a key part of our day, helping children build strength, balance, and coordination through activities like climbing, running, and ball games.
